Cedars Park Community Litter Pick Saturday 20th October 2018

We have a rich mixture of people in our community from the elderly to the young and many people enjoy walking around the estate either with their dogs, their children, or going to and from Tesco.

Our first Litter Pick, which was held on Friday 11th May was organised as a response to a general feeling of dismay at the amount of litter lying around the estate which made it look unkempt and ill cared for. It was really well attended by a group of about 17 people young and old and a collection of several bags full of rubbish was taken to the County Council skips. 

We have a really strong player-membership at present, but do have a possible vacancy for a drummer and an Eb Bass player. Please do contact is if this could be you!



I am PC Stefan Henriksen, from Stowmarket Police Station, and I am one of nine Police Officers throughout Suffolk Constabulary performing the role of Community Engagement Officer. I know many of you already from my years of working in the SNT based in Stowmarket, and I look forward to meeting those I don't yet know.

This is a new role for Suffolk Constabulary which is aimed at greater communication between the Police and you. It does, amongst other things, involve meeting our communities, being in contact with and meeting community representatives, groups and individuals, who would like to receive information from local Police about what we have been doing within the

Armistice 100th Anniversary in Stowmarket

On Sunday, 11th November, 2018
Stowmarket will mark the 100th
anniversary of the end of the First World
War with a parade and services. Jointly
arranged by the Stowmarket Branch of the
Royal British Legion, St Peter & St Mary's
Parish Church and the Town Council, the
commemorations will begin with the
parade marching off from Red Gables at
8.45am, proceeding through the town along
Ipswich Street to the Parish Church where
the service will start at 9.30cm

Following the church service, a short service will be held in the Market Place at 10.50am with the silence observed at 11am, before the parade marches to the Town's Memorial Gates situated on the Recreation Ground for the Poppy Wreath laying ceremony.

Town Mayor, Councillor Linda Baxter said, "As has always been the custom here in Stowmarket, it would be lovely to see as many people as possible attending the Remembrance Parade and Services, especially as this year commemorates the 100th anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that brought an end to four and a half years of conflict."



Free hearing checks in Stowmarket to help those with hearing loss



Ten million people in the UK - one in six of us - have some

degree of hearing loss. It's surprisingly tricky to spot gradual hearing loss as our brains are very good at compensating, so we're not even aware of how much we've lost until things are quite far advanced.

The good news is that there are things you can do to about it. The bad news is that there are potentially serious consequences if you choose to ignore hearing loss, including an increased risk of dementia.

Local hearing care specialists The Hearing Care Centre, offers award winning hearing care services from 25 centres across East Anglia. This year they are celebrating their 20th year in business and they hope to continue to raise awareness about the prevalence of hearing loss, its effect on everyday life and the potential dangers of leaving hearing loss untreated.

Audiologist Karen Finch and her team will be holding a free 'Hearing Care Centre Open Day' at their local hearing clinic at Stowhealth between 9am and 5pm on Thursday 18th October 2018. During the event they will be providing free hearing assessments (usually £20), along with complimentary professional advice about your hearing test results and discussing possible solutions that could help improve your hearing. All services are available by appointment only.

Autumn is an amazing time of the year, so rich in colours, sounds and weather experiences

(warm sunshine, a breezy nip in the air, rain showers for puddle jumping - what's not to like!!) Who knew there were so many activities to do with fallen leaves printing, rubbing, clay modelling, painting, collage, nest building, threading.....the list goes on! But one of the most time-honoured leaf traditions has to be leaf throwing – collecting piles of fallen leaves and just throwing them up in the air. To do this, we had to go out for walks collecting. You may have seen us wandering around with our bags, collecting leaves of all shapes, sizes and colours, finding conkers and acorns, seeing blackberries and fallen fruits.

The Friends of Cedars Park Preschool Committee have put in a locality budget application for an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) to be placed in a cabinet on an external wall of Cedars Park Community Centre. If you happened to walk past the centre right at the beginning of September and glanced through the window, you may well have seen several of the preschool staff undertaking paediatric first aid training. For some this was a refresher of training that we have done several times in the past (and is completed at least every three years) but for others, something new. Training to use an AED was new for us all though. If the locality budget is granted this will be a valuable asset to the local community and whilst we hope it is never needed, it could save someone's life. I'll let you know when there is more news on this.

British Museum and Museum of East Anglian Life team up to offer new local traineeship

The Museum of East Anglian Life (MEAL) has teamed up with the British Museum to give a young person a gateway into a museum career. MEAL is offering a paid traineeship through the British Museum's Museum Futures programme, supported by the National Lottery. Museum Futures is designed to provide a pathway into museum work for young people who may not have considered this career path before.

The traineeship will be based at MEAL, Stowmarket, and will focus on photography and digital work with the museum's collection of objects, creating a new online object catalogue. It runs for one year, from January-December 2019 and comes with a tax-exempt bursary of £13,350. During this time, the trainee will complete an accredited Level 3 diploma in Cultural Heritageand gain in-work skills training and experience to add to their CV and further their career opportunities.

Museum Futures is aimed at diversifying the museum workforce by providing an opportunity for young people without experience in the sector. People aged 18-24 who do not hold an undergraduate degree are therefore particularly encouraged to apply. Candidates whose highest level of qualification is at GCSE or equivalent (Level 2) and those from rural areas of Suffolk are welcomed. Candidates with over 6 months' paid or unpaid experience of working in a museum and/or a postgraduate qualification are not eligible to apply.

MEAL has been chosen by the British Museum as one of eight partner museums across England to offer α Museum Futures traineeship. The trainees across these partner museums will receive training and support coordinated by the British Museum. The group will work together and form a supportive network of young people who can go on to act as champions in the museum and heritage sector or beyond.

Caitlin Peck, Curator at MEAL, says: "We are delighted to offer this opportunity for a young person to get some great paid experience of museum work. They will be getting hands on with our fantastic collection and developing digital skills, alongside a whole range of workplace skills and experience. It would be wonderful if they get the museum bug, but the skills and experience they will gain will move them forward in whatever career they choose. It's all about opening up the opportunities museums can offer to people who may not have previously thought they were for them.'



Chernobyl Children's Lifeline & Charity Shop

18 people from Mid Suffolk have just returned from Belarus where we spent a week delivering aid to various locations. Everyone agreed without doubt; "no words, photographs or videos can truly give you the real picture". All who took part enjoyed the trip although at times it was emotionally hard but still very rewarding. The group took part in a "work experience" activity where they joined a family in a remote village and worked alongside them for the day.

In Minsk we visited the Children's Cancer Hospital delivering gifts to children and young adults, some of whom who have returned for the 2nd or 3rd time. We presented the Hospital with some much needed items such as wheelchairs, blood pressure monitors and oxygenating humidifiers meaning children who need extra oxygen following operations can remain with their parents rather than having to be moved to HDU units.. Amongst the toys we gave out where many of the "Mcdonald Toys" that we had received, these were an amazing success and we welcome these now on an ongoing basis.

Moving on to Stolin we had a "clothing party" and BBQ for the families and children who the group would visit for their work experience. This not only helped the families with clothing but allowed them to get to know the people they would be with them the following day. We also visited another general hospital in the area of David Goradok. As there is no GP service in Belarus ,children with illnesses we would usually treat at home are hospitalised in this type of facility.

Another day the group went to a boarding school for hearing impaired children. The school was closed for the summer break but due to open in the next few days. All the schools must be painted and redecorated before reopening and our group helped the teachers and staff to carry out the various works needed as there would be an official inspection the following day. We also provided bright posters for the walls, a new wall mounted TV , helped with wallpapering, ironing, electrical works and sweeping of the

grounds. The sweeping of the grounds is a thankless tasks done with very inadequate "broomsticks" but must be done daily so none of the berries that fall from the trees are walked into the school.

A great success wherever we went was the provision of reading glasses, just standard 1.99 ones but at one point there was almost a stampede to get them!

Several individual families in very poor circumstances were visited with extra aid and in one instance, with the help of a sponsor, the Charity is helping to provide running water into an isolated home where a young mother lives on her own with 4 children as her husband is seriously ill in hospital and it is very likely he will not be returning home.

We also had the privilege of being invited to attend the opening ceremony which takes place at the beginning of each new school year. This known as "First Bell" and is a very old tradition in Belarus where the pupils in their final year welcome the newcomers to the school. We donated stationary to the school and this was met with tremendous gratitude. When we also added an A3 laminator there were shouts of joy from some of the teachers!

Over the last two days of the trip everyone was able to visit with families of children who had been to the UK. Each small group visited at least 4 children and as usual were met by the welcoming generosity of the Belarussian people. No one wanted dinner in the evening!

Four children will travel to the UK for a group visit in December. The girls will be aged between 9 and 12 years so we are very keen to receive donations of clothing to provide for them whilst they are here and to take home with them. Not only will the break be invaluable to their health, getting them away from the severe winter but they will also get to experience Christmas in the UK!

Carol Eagles, Manager, said, "in the last 3 years we've seen an 16% increase in client numbers, and recently a number of our long serving volunteers have moved on. Our Advisers are busier and we could really do with some new people to pitch in. You don't need any specific qualifications or experience to volunteer with us, just an interest in working with people to make their lives better."

There are several roles available.

Advisers work directly with clients, both face to face and on the telephone. They find out what the client's problem is and explore the options available to sort it out. The Adviser role is really

varied as the charity offers advice on sorting out any kind of problem where it helps to know your rights and responsibilities. Volunteer Advisers get full training in the skills needed to help people to deal with their problems.

Receptionists take care of clients when they arrive and work with the Advice Team to get them seen. The charity is looking for people who are happy to talk to members of the public and have basic computer skills.

Steve Avery, who has been volunteering with Citizens Advice Mid Suffolk for 2 years, said, "I like volunteering here because you make a real difference to people's lives. There's a great team of people and you get a lot of support. I would say to anyone considering volunteering to give it a try because it keeps you connected and up to date."
